b. Report of Staff, re: Posting of Agenda. The Agenda for the April 3, 2014 Governance Board Meeting was posted on March 28, 2014, on the ICIS Web Site and the Bulletin Board outside Glendale City Hall.

#### 3. REPORTS - INFORMATION

a. Reports Regarding Changes in Project Status from Previous Month

Pomona – absent

Beverly Hills - No report

*Montebello* – Gordon Arnold has visited all the sites and is putting a report together on how to invest the \$900,000 in grant money in furthering the P-25 Migration. The money will be used to solve the microwave issues as well as migrate the RF system.

Glendale – Steve Hronek reported the little loop cut over will be April 14. Users will experience site trunking.

Glendale went to bid for local subscriber radios and Kenwood was lowest bid. Kenwood is good for non-public safety and has stated they will give the same low price to any of the ICIS cities. Their mobiles & portables are \$815. Glendale will be issuing a purchase order in the next couple weeks.

Culver City – No report

Burbank – Jim Floyd reported there was a design flaw in their P-25 project which delayed Burbank three weeks. Burbank is  $1-1\frac{1}{2}$  months behind Glendale for P-25. Pasadena – Board Member Rosales reported of she read about an upcoming sale of radio frequency and TV channels on a commercial cell and suggested ICIS look into acquiring frequencies if they are available.

### b. Report from Technical Committee

Executive Director Edey reported during the March 13 meeting of the Technical Committee, Ron Derderian was introduced as the new Chair. The committee discussed the status of various sites and reported that the migration to P-25 is coming along. The committee is seeking grant funding for the 7.14 upgrade. Pomona reported microwave outage and this is probably related to the issues Montebello was experiencing.

- e. Report Regarding LA RICS

Vartan Djihanian of Katz & Associates presented to the ICIS Board on behalf of LA RICS. He encouraged cities to sign off on the site access agreements so soil samples and funding studies may be conducted. The site access agreements do not obligate cities to provide sites to LA RICS. There are a total of 231 sites and if construction does not begin before May or June of this year, the funding will need to be returned to the federal government.

These sites may not provide total access to cities, and additional sites may be required.

There has been no further discussion on membership levels from LA RICS (LMR vs. broadband). There may be a delay in LMR fees but there will be no delay in LTE fees. The proposed ISSI interface between LARICS and ICIS would provide for hand- off that is almost seamless, so it is not a technical challenge but instead a cooperation issue to optimize interoperability.

There has not been any agreement as to how LARICS can and will interoperate with ICIS aside from the ISSI. The last meeting with LARICS, Mr. Pat Mallen, was February 4 and there has not been any follow up with ICIS since that time.

Half of Los Angeles County Fire Departments are already a part of the Verdugo Communications. All Los Angeles Fire Chiefs Association departments are invited to submit a request to use Verdugo Interoperability Communications for mutual aid. This interoperability would be for ICIS communication only and only on ICIS member city incidents. The request will be vetted through Verdugo and the Executive Director. The technical and operations committee will continue to monitor mutual aid talk groups.
